DEMARCATIION raced inside on the first turn, was unhurried while well behind the field, commenced a rally on the far turn, swung five wide at the top of the stretch, was put to a left-handed whip shortly thereafter, closed well to get the lead inside the furlong marker, battled with MISSION IMPAZIBLE late and narrowly prevailed under good handling. MISSION IMPAZIBLE was restless in the gate, set the early pace while off the rail then was challenged by Z HUMOR, was eased back behind that rival outside the half-mile pole, moved to the outside, went three wide on the far turn, regained the lead at the top of the stretch, was asked for his best near the three-sixteenths pole, led into the final furlong, battled back when headed outside the sixteenth-pole, drifted out under left hand urging late and just missed. APART was reserved while inside on the first turn, moved out with five furlongs to run, ranged up while four wide on the far turn, was asked nearing the quarter-pole, came under the whip in upper stretch and lacked the needed kick while well clear for the show. Z HUMOR raced three wide on the first turn, moved up to contest the pace on the outside, inched clear nearing the half-mile pole, lost the lead at the top of the stretch and gave way. LE GRAND CRU was restless in the gate, settled in third, went three then two wide on the far turn, was asked in the vicinity of the five-sixteenths pole and came up empty. MIDNIGHT MISCHIEF broke out a bit at the start, was reserved towards the rear, came under some urging near the five-sixteenths pole and failed to respond.
